Abstract

Traditional bathrooms are one of the best architectural structures that include architectural, environmental, technical and vernacular values. For the last decades Because of Modernist views and their Productions for the life (Such as designing bathrooms for the houses) these traditional bathrooms have gradually been forgotten and ultimately placed in the path of destruction. As an example we can notice to Khosro Agha bathroom in Isfahan, near valuable buildings protected perimeter (Located within Twenty feet far from Chehelsotoon mansion) had demolished.
