Mvyad in his book as complementary and alternative medicine therapies in the treatment of male infertility writes, in the study of 34 randomized clinical trial on the treatment of male infertility supplements that have been used to greater chances of pregnancy and live birth among men who regimes the supplement includes coenzyme Q- ton, N-acetylcysteine carnitine, omega-3 fatty acids and vitamin C had used more than others. Red and colleagues in a study of 32 infertile couples in two infertility centers in Canada found that most complementary and alternative medicine methods used include lifestyle changes (diet and exercise) and acupuncture, herbal medicine and religious practices (eg prayer fetish and worship) were. April and colleagues in 2014 to use techniques such as naturopathy, acupuncture, traditional Chinese medicine, hypnosis and practitioners active role in infertility treatment and support methods of complementary and alternative medicine has had interviews with physicians Ottawa, Canada, pointed out.

Discussion and conclusion:

Any type of complementary or alternative methods for prevention and treatment of infertility Rvdjht alongside conventional treatments and assisted reproductive Mvrdsht still study in the treatment of infertility and safety of these methods are not available.
