





Conjunctival metastasis from gastric leiomyosarcoma, a case report

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Abstract

Leiomyosarcoma is a malignant tumor of mesenchymal cells and is the most common soft tissue sarcoma. Leiomyosarcoma is an extremely rare tumor in ocular and periocular region and can be primary, secondary or metastatic. Prior to the advent of C-Kit immunoreactivity, the majority of gastrointestinal stromal tumors were classified as leiomyosarcoma.

We represent a 82 years old man with gastric leiomyosarcoma metastatsized to the conjunctive, esophagus, liver, and lung. In this case, immunoreactivity for desmin and SMA and negativity for C- Kit confirmed the diagnosis of leiomyosarcoma.
